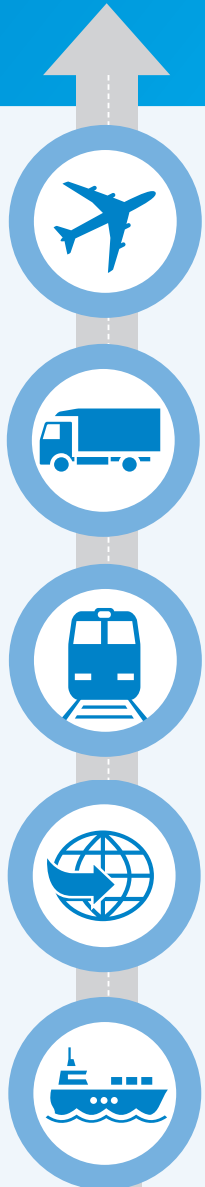


Implementation of the New Standards for Training Packages



New Standards for Training Packages

New Standards for Training Packages were endorsed by the Standing Council on Tertiary Education, Skills and Employment (SCOTESE) on 16 November 2012.

By 31 December 2015, all training packages are required to meet the new standards which can be found at http://www.nssc.natese.gov.au/training_packages.

The new structure of Training Packages will enable users to locate the material they need. Assessment requirements will be in a separate document to the Unit of Competency. Guidance and supporting information will be available in a dedicated Companion Volume.

The process of implementing the new standards will confirm that content is fit for purpose or identify where changes are needed.

The Transport and Logistics Industry Skills Council will ensure that the process of implementing the New Standards for Training Packages in the context of the policy framework is -

- ▶ transparent
- ▶ industry led
- ▶ an opportunity to strengthen training packages

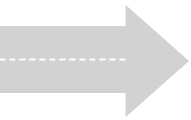
The process

- ▶ supports high quality outcomes for performance standards and assessment
- ▶ provides the opportunity to review and validate existing packages to ensure the units are fit for purpose, accurate and current
- ▶ strengthens the consistency of assessments and assessor requirements
- ▶ simplifies and removes duplication
- ▶ clearly separates performance outcomes and assessment
- ▶ clarifies licensing and regulatory requirements

There will be a period of activity as the training packages are revised to meet the requirements of the new standards.

As with any proposed review and change process with the training packages, validation is a critical part of the process. Project reference groups including the steering committees and technical advisory groups will have an important role in implementation.

The network of state and federal consultative groups will also be consulted throughout the process.
